

Cross challenges the widely held assumption, not least among Baptists, that baptism is merely symbolic, a believer's testimony to what God *has* done in the past. He examines this position biblically, theologically and historically and finds it wanting. Restating an understanding more faithful to biblical and early Baptist teaching he argues that baptism always has been an integral part of becoming a Christian and that it was always faith-baptism. Cross also contends for an evangelical use of the term sacrament, as he affirms what God *does* in baptism in the present. This restatement of a key Baptist conviction is particularly addressed to all who claim scripture as their rule of faith and practice, urging the necessity of reform of both the theology and practice of baptism in the contemporary church.
